John Thompson, PhD

Dr. Thompson is a Paediatric and Perinatal Epidemiologist, who initially trained in Statistics, at the University of Auckland. His first involvement with SIDS/SUDI research was with the well-known NZ Cot Death Study. He is a Board member of the International Society for the Study and Prevention of Infant Death.

He is currently chair of the scientific committee for the upcoming ISPID meeting in Florence, Italy. Since undertaking his PhD which investigated risk factors for small for gestation age infants, along with ongoing research into SUDI, his research interests have expanded into stillbirth, orofacial cleft and child dental health, resulting in the publication of over 240 peer reviewed scientific papers to date.
